The Impact Your Donation Makes

AGING AND SPECIAL NEEDS

- \$1.00 a week (\$52.00/year) provides curb-to-curb transportation to a medical appointment, senior center, or grocery store for one senior every month.
- \$5.00 a week (\$260.00/year) provides a hot, nutritious meal to a home-bound senior for a year, helping them remain in their home among family and friends.
- \$10.00 a week (\$520.00/year) provides activities for five seniors.

COMMUNITY HEALTH

- \$1.00 a week (\$52.00/year) provides healthy, nutritious meals to five individuals in shelter.
- \$5.00 a week (\$260.00/year) pays for class materials for 20 families learning about supporting loved ones with mental illness.
- \$10.00 a week (\$520.00/year) will fund airline tickets to fly an individual to cancer treatment in Seattle.

EDUCATION, CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

- \$1.00 a week (\$52.00/year) provides an adult and child mentoring activity for two children.
- \$5.00 a week (\$260.00/year) covers the cost for two campers at scout camp.
- \$10.00 a week (\$520.00/year) provides a six week GED preparation course for five young adults.

SELF-SUFFICIENCY AND BASIC NEEDS

- \$1.00 a week (\$52.00/year) provide supplies for a family night event to serve 100 people.
- \$5.00 a week (\$260.00/year) pays for two victims of domestic violence to be flown to a shelter on Prince of Wales island.
- \$10.00 a week (\$520.00/year) can sponsor 17 children's annual enrollment in the Imagination Library.
