DAY OF CARING

Day of Caring is an annual tradition where volunteers from the community work to create lasting change and provide immediate support to United Way of Southeast Alaska's nonprofit partners by undertaking projects to improve our communities.

Every fall residents, businesses, and schools throughout Southeast Alaska lend a helping hand to give back and make their communities great. In the past 7 years, 1,300 hours have been given by 350 volunteers working on 85 service projects in Juneau, Ketchikan and Sitka during our Day of Caring events.

SAFV

For more than 40 years now, Sitkans Against Family Violence (SAFV) has been providing empowermentbased safety and advocacy for victims of domestic violence and sexual abuse, as well as promoting a culture of non-violence and respect.

SAFV relies heavily on its volunteers. Volunteers donate an average of 1050 hours per year, answering the crisis hotline, assisting with direct advocacy, providing childcare and helping with fundraising, special events, youth-based programs, safe homes and shelter maintenance.

BREAKFAST PROGRAM

This school year, the Juneau School District is offering free breakfast for all students at elementary and middle schools.

The Juneau Community Foundation and United Way of Southeast Alaska teamed up with Avista, Alaska Native Sisterhood Camp 70, the Benito and Frances C. Gaguine Fund and the Juneau School District to provide the funding needed for these vital food programs for students.

READ ON THE FLY

In 2017 we partnered with Read on the Fly, Alaska Airlines, and many local partners and business supporters to bring free books for traveling kids to airports in Southeast Alaska. In an effort to give kids and families more opportunities to read, bookshelves are stocked with free children's books that families can take on their journeys.

We are excited to share that this first quarter Juneau's Read On the Fly partners stocked 1,200 books at the Juneau airport. So far we estimate about 300 books have "flown" off the shelves!



Joy Lyon, United Way of Southeast Alaska Board of Directors

Joy Lyon has lived her entire life as a volunteer. Beginning as an AmeriCorps VISTA volunteer straight out of college, she spent the next several decades giving time and energy to the community.

For the past four years, she has volunteered with the United Way as a member of its board of directors.

"With one-on-one volunteering, the reward is more immediate. With board service, you have to take the long view," she says. "But there's real camaraderie involved, a sense of doing important work together."

As a United Way board member, Joy brings the perspective of smaller community non-profits. Professionally, she serves as Executive Director of the Association for the Education of Young Children-Southeast Alaska (AEYC-SEA), an organization she's been with since 1996.
